

As the arts sector grapples with major challenges, public funding is more critical than ever.






ADDITIONAL PUBLIC FUNDING

All respondents agreed that additional public funding is critical for the arts sector to transform and adapt to be more sustainable. Key areas for support include:


- diversifying revenue streams

The survey gathered data between June and July 2024 from 7,255 respondents including 5,791 individuals and groups and 1,464 organizations. Respondents were from every province and territory and reported working in all disciplines and fields of practice.
